

Barbe vs. Acadiana
Game Notes
October 29, 2021

1. This will be the 34th meeting between these two schools with Barbe holding a 19-14 edge in the series. Barbe has scored 907 points (averaging 27 per game) while Acadiana has scored 777 points (averaging 24 per contest). Scores of previous meetings, with Barbe score listed first, are as follows:

2. This will be the 6th district game for both teams. Barbe enters the contest at 3-5 overall (2-3 in District). Acadiana is 6-2 overall (5-0 in District, leading District 3-5A). Acadiana's schedule thus far in 2021 is:

3. In District games, Acadiana is averaging 52.6 points per game while giving up 12.2 for an average game differential of 40.4.
4. For the year, Barbe's scores have averaged 36-36, while Acadiana is averaging 36-13.
5. Coach Mike Cutrera has compiled an overall winning record of 86-32 (73%). This is currently the 2nd highest winning percentage of all Barbe head coaches:

Charles Vicknair	1978-1981	79.60%	(39-10)
Mike Cutrera	2011-	72.88%	(86-32)
Jimmy Shaver	1982-2010	70.42%	(238-100)

These 3 coaches have compiled an amazing 71.88% winning percentage over the last 42+ years (363-142) at Barbe.

6. Barbe has not had a losing season since 1977, when they went 2-8 under head coach Dale Barbeau. Charles Vicknair was hired as head coach in 1978 and the Bucs went 10-3 that year starting a string of 42 straight years of not having a losing season and making the playoffs in 39 of those 42 years. (In 1979, Barbe was 8-2 but did not make the playoffs.)

NOTES FROM SULPHUR GAME

1. In last week's 31-35 loss to Sulphur, Barbe had 402 offensive yards (145 rushing and 257 passing). Barbe ran 71 offensive plays (42 rushing and 29 passing). Barbe averaged 5.7 yards per play on the offensive side of the ball.

2. Barbe was 4 for 14 on third down conversions (29%).
3. Time of possession favored Barbe 26:23 to 21:37 for Sulphur.
4. Tylan Ceasar lead the team in rushing picking up 99 yards on 24 attempts averaging 4.1 yards per carry.
5. Will McClain completed 17 of 29 passes (59%) for 257 yards and 2 touchdowns.
6. Jamaal Levi led all receivers with 10 catches for 118 yards, averaging 11.8 yards per catch and scored 1 touchdown by receiving. Reed Boyd caught 1 pass for 70 yards and scored 1 touchdown by receiving.
7. Collin Medlin punted three times averaging 32.3 yards per punt with one punt downed inside the opponents 20-yard line.
8. Kandyn Cordova and Cory Sonnier lead the team in tackles with 7 each.

SEASON NOTES

1. Barbe stands 3-5 (2-3 in District) for the season, averaging 33.5 points per game while surrendering 36.5 points per game.
2. Offensively, Barbe is averaging 434.3 yards per game (149.8 rushing and 284.5 passing).
3. Barbe has scored 14 touchdowns by rushing and 23 by passing.
4. Barbe is 31 for 86 (36%) on third down conversions.
5. Barbe is even in turnovers having turned the ball over 11 times and taken 11 turnovers from opponents.
6. Tylan Ceasar leads the team in rushing picking up 675 net yards on 134 carries, averaging 5.0 yards per rush, averaging 84.4 yards per game and scored 4 rushing touchdowns.
7. Will McClain has completed 115 of 203 passes (57%) for 2,193 yards and 22 touchdowns. He is averaging 274.1 passing yards per game.
8. Jamaal Levi has caught 59 passes for 1,378 yards, averaging 23.4 yards per catch and 172.3 yards per game with 17 receiving touchdowns.

9. Jamaal Levi leads the team in all-purpose yards with 1,766 (1,378 receiving, 35 on punt returns, 337 on kickoff returns and 16 rushing) averaging 220.8 yards per game.
10. Collin Medlin has punted 25 times averaging 34.7 yards per punt with 2 of his punts being fair caught and 4 punts being downed inside the opponents 20-yard line.
11. Jamaal Levi leads the team in scoring with 132.
12. Defensively, Kandyn Cordova leads the team with 76 tackles including 3.5 tackles for loss, been credited with breaking up 4 passes and has 1 fumble recovery. Johnnie Hardy has 57 tackles with 4.5 for loss, 0.5 sacks, intercepted 1 pass, recovered 1 fumble and forced 1 fumble.

STATE STATISTICAL LEADERS

1. Jamaal Levi leads the state in receiving yards with 1,378.
2. Jamaal Levi is 2nd in the state with 17 receiving touchdowns. (Leader is Tristan Wiley from Ouachita Christian with 19).
3. Will McClain is currently 3rd in the state with 2,193 passing yards. (Landry Lyddy-Calvary Baptist with 2,535 and Kameron Evans-Huntington with 2,502)
4. Will McClain is 4th in the state with 22 touchdown passes. (Landry Lyddy-Calvary Baptist has 32, Kameron Evans-Huntington has 32 and Landon Graves-Ouachita Christian has 25)

STATE POWER RATING

1. Entering week 9, Acadiana stands at 8 and Barbe at 43 in the Class 5A non-select power ratings. The top 32 teams make the playoffs. Barbe has made the playoffs for 28 consecutive years, 1992-2019 (excluding the 2020 season when they did not compete).

SCHOOL RECORDS

1. Jamaal Levi broke the school record for most 200-yard receiving games in the regular season with his 3rd against Sam Houston. The old record was set by Trey Quinn in 2010 and matched in 2012 when he had 2 in each season. Jamaal had the following receiving yards in games this year:

2. Jamaal Levi broke another school record when he returned a kick-off for a touchdown against Lafayette. It marked the 2nd kick-off return for a touchdown for the Barbe receiver this year and in his career. The old school record was 1 held by the following former players:
