

Barbe vs. New Iberia

Game Notes

September 30, 2016

1. This will be the 22nd meeting between these two schools. Barbe comes into this contest with an overall 18-3 record against New Iberia. Barbe has won the last 2 contests by scores of 49-35 (2015) and 33-9 (2014). New Iberia won the 2013 game 31-28.
2. Coach Mike Cutrera has compiled an overall winning record of 51-17 (75%). This is currently the 2nd highest winning percentage of all Barbe head coaches:

Charles Vicknair	1978-1981	79.60%	(39-10)
Mike Cutrera	2011-	75.00%	(51-17)
Jimmy Shaver	1982-2010	70.42%	(238-100)

These 3 coaches have compiled an amazing 72.09% winning percentage over the last 39 years (328-127) at Barbe.

3. Barbe has averaged 33.5 points and 390.5 yards of offense during the first 4 games of 2016. Barbe's defense has held their opponents to 15.5 points and 272.8 yards per game.
4. Kirkland Banks now has 6,233 all-purpose yards (rushing, receiving, kick-off returns and punt returns) in his career at Barbe. This places the senior running back in 3rd place all-time at Barbe, having passed Ernest Celestie (5,603) earlier this season. In 2016 Kirkland is averaging 180.3 all-purpose yards per game:

5. Gavin Nettles has 5,393 yards passing in his career placing him in 3rd place in Barbe history:

6. Gavin Nettles has thrown 55 touchdown passes in his career placing him tied with Eric Cutrera in 2nd place all-time in Barbe history:

1. Kennon Fontenot (2010-13)	116
2. Eric Cutrera (2006-08)	55
3. Gavin Nettles (2013-)	55 (49 through 2015)
4. Slade Nagle (1993-96)	45
5. Jared Foster (2009-10)	43

7. Gavin passed for 2,573 yards during 2015. He passed for 2,230 yards in 2014. He is only the second quarterback in Barbe history to pass for more than 2,000 yards in two seasons. Kennon Fontenot did it 3 times (4,294 yards in 2012, 3,804 yards in 2013 and 2,561 yards in 2011).

8. Gavin has passed for more than 20 touchdowns in two seasons (27 in 2015 and 22 in 2014) becoming only the third quarterback to accomplish this feat in Barbe history – joining Eric Cutrera (22 in 2007 and 26 in 2008) and Kennon Fontenot (25 in 2011, 47 in 2012 and 44 in 2013).

9. Gavin has completed 70.18% of his passes during 2016 which is currently higher than the school record he set last year (69.28%). Kennon Fontenot completed 68.66% of his passes during 2013 which was the previous school record.

10. Gavin has a NCAA quarterback rating of 188.4 so far this season. Sophomore Luke Richard has subbed in with a 117.5 rating.

11. Kirkland Banks now has 4 punt returns for touchdowns in his career which is a new Barbe school record breaking the old record of 2 held by Scott Ayres (1979-1980) and Janzen Jackson (2008). Janzen Jackson had his 2 in one game vs Carencro on September 10, 2008.

12. Banks also has 1 kick-off return for a touchdown in his career which ties the school record held by Scott Labiche (1981), Eric Stevens (1982), Andy Hawkins (1986), Justin Vincent (2000), Jarreth Rougeau (2010), Jhoby Lewis (2010) and Trey Quinn (2013).

13. Kirkland Banks has rushed for 544 yards in Barbe's first 4 games this season (averaging 136 yards per game). He is seeking to become only the 2nd running back in school history with three 1,000 yard rushing seasons:

Scott Ayres (1979, 1980)

Paul Demarie (1983, 1984)

Chad Cooley (1989, 1990)

Dwight Collins (1995, 1996)

Justin Vincent (1999, 2000, 2001) – only 3 time 1,000 yard rusher

Eric Fry (2003, 2004)

Courtney Gallentine (2011, 2012)

Kirkland Banks (2014, 2015)
